Clubs, which are free to parents, providing children with opportunities to excel in different sports and providing pupils eligible for pupil premium (PP) with the same opportunities as their peers. To develop subject knowledge for teaching staff on the delivery of high-quality PE lessons. Children to experience PE specialist to further develop their physical literacy and skill - building into sports games. Engage, enthuse and spark interest for children in PE and to further engage them in sports clubs outside of school.

Children develop a love for being outdoors which will stay with them long beyond participation in beach activities. Children will have a good understanding of the links between Beach School sessions and the wider curriculum.
Swimming Lessons	£465	£465	 Year 3 Children have swimming lessons from qualified instructors at Torbay Leisure Centre. Children are taught at their level in groups and in whole class Children gain water confidence and learn to swim.
Dance Workshops	£2475	£2475	 To meet the requirements of the National Curriculum in Dance To extend dance skills beyond this to identify and nurture talent for dancing. To use for performance to encourage and develop skills and to inspire for dancers of the future. To link with a community provider. Further develop opportunities for children to engage in physical activity that children may not be able to engage in within the local area. Increased opportunities for children to develop their health and fitness and mental health and wellbeing. Clubs, which are free to parents, providing children with opportunities to excel in different sports and providing PP children with the same opportunities as their peers. Children will be provided with opportunities to develop their skills from an early age which will, in turn, allow them to continue to develop their fluency in this area as they progress through school.
